AUGUST ADVOCACY REPORT

- The Advocacy Committee members met via Zoom meeting on Monday 31 July 2023.
- Preparation was discussed for presentation of Child/forced marriage motion for Conference. Lynda Galway provided a detailed graphic organiser for Advocacy members to complete regarding evidence to support motion. Potential questions Carole Tomvald may need to address from delegates were considered, with Advocacy members adding additional Carole and Cecil suggestions. subsequently completed significant work on a speech and advised how presentation would be assembled.
- Carole sought and obtained approval to rewrite the Motion Rational into a two page, more comprehensive version, considering other clubs' more detailed submissions.
- Lawrence Ezedinma sought response to the request from Marie of the Zonta Club, Redcliffe asking for assistance to set up their own Gym initiative regarding Domestic Violence and Coercive Control. Members were agreeable to assisting, subject to retaining ownership of our materials developed and recognition of our club's creation of the initiative. It was agreed to discuss this with the members of Zonta Caboolture at the next Dinner meeting in August.
- It was agreed that updates on 16 Days of Activism and the progress of the club's Web Page would be left for the next Advocacy meeting, to focus on finalising the Motion before Conference.
- Subsequent to the Advocacy meeting, thanks
 to Carole and Cecil for collecting additional
 Orange figures, and collected by Carole. Cecil
 suggested requesting the club approve a \$200
 donation to the men's shed for their work
 done on behalf of Zonta Caboolture.

CONSTITUTION & BYLAWS REPORT, JULY 2023 Mitra, Carole, Pam B, and Cecil met early in August to complete approved changes from the 2022 Zonta

International Conventions for Club constitutions. Mitra typed in these required changes, and our revised Club Constitution is still being edited and will be completed early September at our Committee meeting when Cecil returns from NT.

In addition, the Committee studied the Office of Fair Trading paper on Internal Grievances Procedure, and Mitra later provided another summary procedures for grievances. At the early September meeting the Committee will suggest steps to follow based on parts of the Office of Fair Trading paper, ideas from other resources for members to consider during September.

While we need to insert the approved Zonta changes from the 2022 Convention directly into our Constitution, it is suggested that for the internal grievance procedures, there can be a reference to these them in the Constitution, for example:

The Zonta Club of Caboolture will be obliged to follow appropriate procedures as outlined in the Club's Policy and Procedures Guidelines for Internal Grievances, based on parts of the Office of Fair Trading procedures, and other resources, as appropriate for our Club.

The actual Policy and Procedures Guidelines for Internal Grievances will be separate from the Constitution. The advantage is that if ever we wanted to change aspects of the procedures to suit our Club's operations, we do not need to change the Constitution, just our Guidelines.

Timeline:

- August Dinner Meeting: Progress report
- Early September:
 - Committee Meeting to finalise Draft Revised Constitution and Draft Procedures for Internal Grievances
 - Send to all members the above draft copies. There will be opportunity for members to send comments to Committee
- At least a fortnight before September dinner meeting:
 - Send to members a resolution from the Committee to approve changes and quidelines

September Dinner Meeting: Discuss and ratify changes.


